




The Future is Now




This is the beginning of 180mag, the first two issues that I produced. For this story I was using a model I worked with for several years, she was great, I was learning.

When we use a camera as a microtome and section time, does it scream in agony.



























And so we leave our band of adventurers to their intrigue and return to our own land.
